From the Principal...

It's moments like these – 25 of them in fact – that show exactly what students can do!

As a group of teachers learning and developing skills together, the teaching staff at Bothwell participate in colleague observations. Each teacher identifies a focus area and a colleague comes into their class observes their teaching and then provides notes/explanations of what they saw and understood from the teaching and learning in relation to the area they selected. In a very collaborative way, we are learning from each other, how to better engage and support our students.

It is often a senior staff responsibility to supervise classes when teachers are conducting colleague observations. I completely forgot one supervision this week and it resulted in a very good lesson for everyone concerned.

Students in Grades 8 – 10 were left unsupervised in their classroom for 25 minutes!

In that time they organised between themselves that they would keep quiet, find something to do and not tell anyone they were unsupervised. There was no language to be heard coming from classrooms, no one wandered around the school – they were pretty much perfect!

My office wall backs on to their classroom and I can share with you – they were very quiet!

After finally becoming aware that the students were unsupervised and before finishing for lunch we went into the classroom to congratulate them. In demonstrating maturity, cooperation, listening etc., students showed exactly what they can do when they set their mind to it.

Having just proofread student reports (to be handed out Week 2, Term 3) I shared with them that most and all at some point in their report had a teacher comment that they talked too much, were silly when unsupervised or wouldn't do the best they could with their work. For a good number of our students these negative behaviours have actually resulted in an assessment lower than what the teacher believes students are capable of and encouraged to do.

Regular reminders to students to try harder, apply themselves more consistently, stop talking / socialising and prioritise their learning are falling on deaf ears with half-hearted explanations that they can't concentrate, can't work with other students in the room. Just want to talk instead of work... the challenge for these students – and probably any of our students – is to do their best, to stop using excuses and concentrate on their learning – they have after all shown us exactly what they can do!

Parents are encouraged to have a discussion with students in regard to doing their best all the time, not just when it suits – because it is a comment in a lot of student reports!

Have a great holiday, we look forward to seeing you at parent teacher meetings in Week 2.


Student Council

School Library Books




If any student still has a School Library book at home, can you please return them tomorrow.
