From the Principal..

Wandering around classrooms this week it has been interesting to hear the conversations that are going on, some between teachers others between teachers and students.

The most interesting are the discussions students are having between themselves about learning!

Something we as a staff have been examining is the difference between teaching and learning. It is the responsibility of ever teacher to plan and provide learning opportunities around the appropriate areas for all students in their class. This means tailoring activities for the different year groups we have (a significant challenge with the multiple grade groups) as well as varying them again for students who need extension or extra support. No matter how well organised a teacher is, no matter how well planned they are, their skills are limited to teaching.

Teachers cannot do the learning for students, we cannot make students engage, we cannot make students responsible for their own learning, and this has to come from the students themselves.

I'd like to share with you a conversation I was lucky enough to be a part of. Students were discussing some assessments they had received for recent Maths work – the actual scores are approximated. Walking into the classroom, a pile of Maths Assignments were on the teachers' desk. The top one had an A and a score of 37/45. On congratulating the student for the huge effort, another student piped in with, "I got an A too, but I got a few wrong." This student then asked another student their score, "I didn't get an A this time because I missed a few." Both students then shared that one of the students in the class had achieved a perfect score – the students having this discussion were genuinely interested in the achievements of their peers and sharing their success. In Maths recently students have been attempting some tasks multiple times in an effort to improve their understanding. Students work on an area of the Australian Curriculum with their teacher, they practise and are then tested on their understanding. The work is marked and students are then supported to understand where they made mistakes and practise again before redoing the assessment tasks. Any improvements they make are then recorded as their final score.

It's not important that students understand things the first time – it is just important that they understand them and take responsibility for the learning! I must thank Byron, Stella, Adam and Jacob for including me in this conversation and say Well Done for taking responsibility for your own learning!

We would like students to wear either blue or pink for the day and contribute towards fundraising with a gold coin donation.


We will be selling pink and/or blue cupcakes at recess to raise more funds for the Cancer Council.






We will be holding a Book week Parade in the Flexi Room
