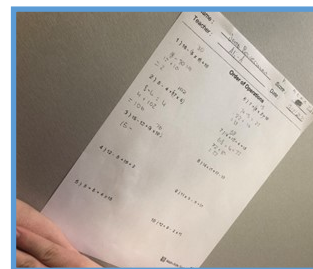
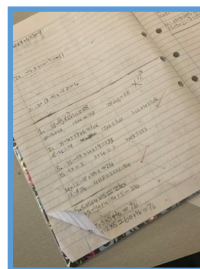
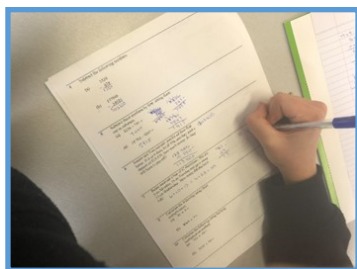
**Year to Date (2020)**

Classes have begun to settle and a solid work ethic is developing across all classes. Something we are often asked about is how we ensure that all children are working at their grade level with more than one class in the school made up of students from two and three year groups.

Teacher planning is critical and as we move around the school it's clear to see that this is playing out as grade appropriate learning opportunities for students. These were just a selection of the different tasks students were working on in Class 4 Maths this morning.



New to our school this year Mr Joseph Gracia has joined us as a dedicated Art teacher. An artist himself Mr Gracia is very keen to build the profile of Art in our school and ensure all of our students have the opportunity to experience this subject. Mr Gracia will take dedicated Art lessons in primary classes and an elective for secondary students.

## What's been happening at Bothwell DHS over the holidays.

Our community take a great deal of interest and pride in our school which is fantastic. A number of people have asked about the amount of activity onsite over January. Annual school holiday maintenance and new projects have been completed in time for students returning to school. So much has been achieved in a few short weeks including;

**Kinder Playground** -Remove timber edge from playground that was a trip hazard, lower playground equipment to meet Australian standards, install new concrete edging, lower soft fall, install new concrete paths and concrete pad for the cubby house. Complete cubby house repairs and remove the old galvanised water line to student vegetable garden with a new poly line.

**Cricket Nets** - Cricket pitches have been extended in both nets to allow wickets to be installed at both ends. The Student Council have raised enough funds to install artificial turf on one pitch which will happen in the next few months.

**Electrical Works** - Install new data to Home Ec. Room and MDT. These rooms can now be added to the existing phone system. Upgrade power and security alarm infrastructure to school farm. Security light repairs have also been completed.

**Plumbing Repairs** -Plumbing repairs have been carried out in a number of areas of the school including gymnasium showers.

**Re-painting of external buildings** - As part of the school maintenance plan each year funds are set aside and a section of the school to have a complete paint strip, weather board repairs and repaint.

**School Farm** -Our school farm is starting to take shape and Learning opportunities will be offered in the near future. A number of WHS issues have been rectified including; unsafe trees removed, storage containers moved to a better location, removal of the old sewerage system located on the school farm, the upgrade of the power supply and security system. Re fencing the farm will begin over the next few weeks, we look forward to working with Mr Bruce O'Toole and our students.

Many thanks to all our contractors, they have worked extremely hard to complete works before the students returned last week. The quality of work is brilliant and I have no hesitation in recommending them to anyone.



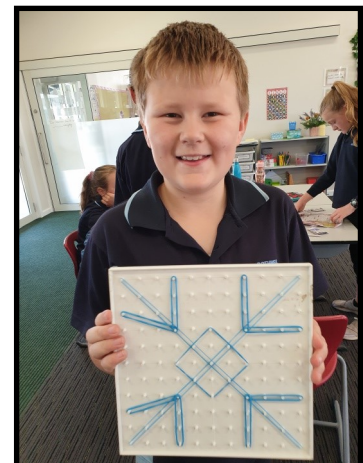
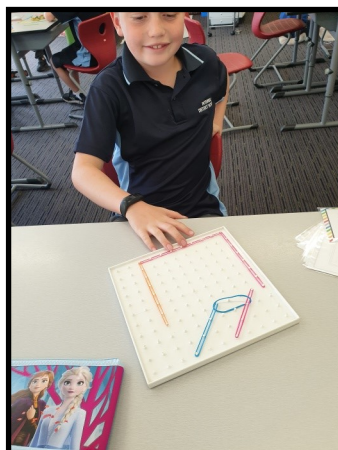
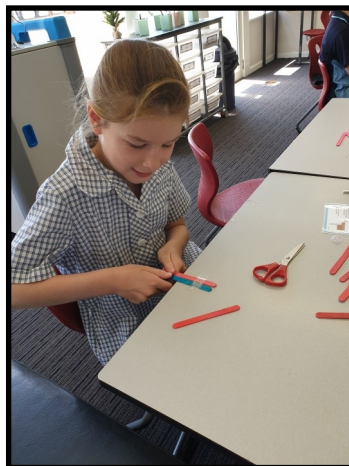




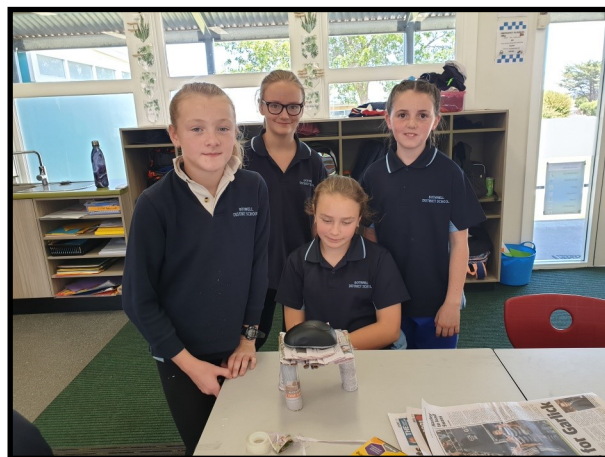
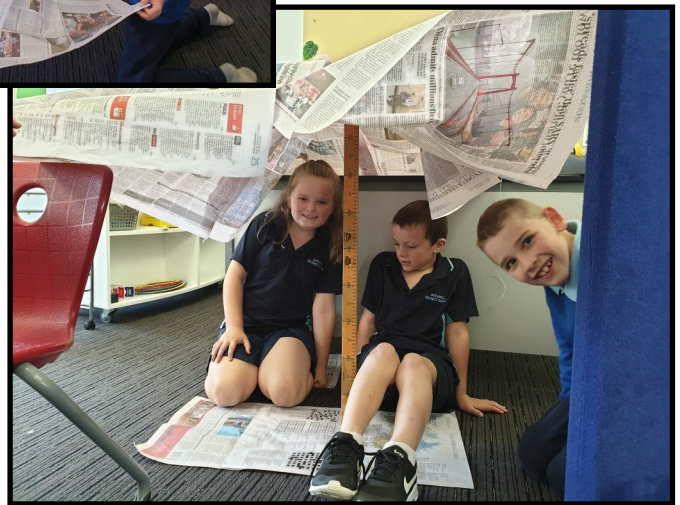
