In the staff days before students returned to school, all Bothwell District High School staff complete work focussed on supporting students to be the best they can be. One of the strategies identified was to celebrate the achievements of past and present Bothwell students and staff in this way our students can be proud of their school. It seems quite appropriate that we start with one of our newest staff members. The following, written by Mr O'Toole is an account of how, as a former student of the school, he returns to Bothwell this year with responsibility for the engagement and retention of students supporting the provision of 11-12 at our school.

Hello. I've been asked to introduce myself, or rather re-introduce myself to the Bothwell District School community. My name is Bruce O'Toole and I grew up in Bothwell, living on my grandparent's property known as Hunterston where my Dad and Mum (nee Allison) worked while raising us seven kids. I am married to Lisa who is wonderful (she may read this) and very supportive, 3 perfect sons (panel beater/spray painter, builder and Uni student (another teacher on the way)), two gorgeous dogs, a horse, a small farming enterprise, and a bleed'n big mortgage. I attended Bothwell District School and have plenty of fond (vague) memories, mainly of Mr Husband, the weekly walk to the library, the woodwork workshop, the edge of the building where I cut my head open, the bus trip, the nice people, and the footy ground. I left Bothwell in 1977 (struth!), worked in Hobart for a year or two and joined the Royal Australian Air Force as a Police Dog Security Officer (Doggie). After nine years of service with the RAAF I became the senior ranger for Mt Annan, near Campbelltown, NSW. In the early nineties I returned home to Tassie and worked for the Department of Primary Industries and purchased a small farm in the north of the state. Interest rates were 17%, overdraft 21%, canning peas at 28 cents a kilo, I got top price for a small pen of fat lambs at \$31 a head. That experience didn't end well however it made me more resilient and I decided to follow the dream I'd had from high school, but had always believed it was out of my reach.



In 1996 I enrolled in the University of Tasmania and graduated with a Bachelor of Education in 2000. For the last 18 years I have worked at the one location, playing mentor and educator at a rather unique Tasmanian public school. What wonderful and challenging experiences, from a wee little lad from Bothwell, Tasmania.

When I was growing up, Bothwell was a remote location. A gorgeous place with the wealth of farming and all the wonderful characters that worked on the farms and in the local industries, but as the world gets 'smaller', so too does Bothwell become much less remote. Vehicles are safer and quicker, internet connections are bringing people closer and giving us access to so many services, and schools are more accountable and resourced to ensure equity for all Tasmanian students whilst aiming for the best possible outcomes. That is where my role comes in to play. My position title is Retention and Engagement. I hope that with my skills, genuine desire to see kids reach their potential, and the belief that an inquiry based approach to learning that is underpinned by meaningful projects that connect with our students and their community should help them grow academically whilst applying knowledge in a real world context.

Late last year I approached Ms Davey to see if there was any chance of me returning to Bothwell as one of her teachers. WHY? Well, I believe I was overdue for a move, I am very passionate about helping kids realise their potential and self-worth, I remember school was like wallpaper, and some people thought our hand had been dealt and the remoteness would determine our futures. My first paragraph proves that wrong and I am hoping that with the support of the wonderful teachers and support staff at BDS, I will help instil within our students the belief that their efforts will result in them growing whilst meeting their future needs.

Some of the ways I hope to do the above is through the experiences the BDS farm offers. I want our students to value the significant contribution farming makes to the Australian economy and that farming is extremely diverse, including tractors, broad acre cropping, livestock and intensive horticulture. I want our students to understand that farming is a science that requires innovative thinking, is sustainable and ethical and the industry offers an extensive array of employment opportunities from working on the farm, research and development, education, marketing, transport and self-driven agriculture enterprises. I want to work with industry leaders, utilising their expertise and make connections between the school and the local community. Coincidentally, our first long term monoculture crop has incredibly close connections with Scotland.

I look forward to meeting and catching up with you all.








The Grade 8/9/10's in their art/design/technology class were working hard on completing grid drawings. Students were split into groups of four, each student had a section of a drawing to complete.

Children with hearing problems often fail to progress well in school. If any parent/ carer has any concerns that their child may have a hearing problem, you can refer your child for a hearing assessment at school. Contact the office to speak to the School Health Nurse for more information

Some things to look for in your child if you think they may have poor hearing or a problem include:

- Has difficulty understanding what people are saying.
- Has speech or language delays or problems articulating things.
- Complains of ear pain, earaches or noises.
- Experience discomfort, fatigue and a short attention span.
- Moves one ear forward when listening or says they can only hear out of their good ear.


