No doubt parents and families generally would be quite aware of the easing of restrictions that have commenced through the advice of public health in the management of the COVID19 virus. As teachers we're all quite excited to be getting our children back! A day or two without students to catch up on work is nice but after that—it becomes quite frustrating.


I would just like to take this opportunity to share with you the various processes in place to support your children and keep our school healthy as we move toward full attendance. We are very aware that we still do not have vaccines for this virus and keeping everybody safe is the most important thing. The extra cleaning routines we have established will be maintained. Exercise and play equipment will remain closed for now. To support this we currently have all children playing at recess and lunch time at the front of the school. We will continue to encourage sensible social distancing, actually extending this by encouraging adults moving in and out of our school to keep their time on site as short as possible. Some schools have adopted a "drop and go" approach to collecting and leaving children. As a part of this we will also be encouraging you to stay in contact with us but to use email, telephone or text to do so. If teachers need to contact you, they too be using these communication tools.

We will continue to ensure that staff and students are practicing strong, effective health and hygiene practices by providing all classrooms and work spaces with the products required to do this. A number of parents have asked me, what if we get more cases, can we take our children back home? Absolutely yes you can and again, school will support you to do so in line with Public Health advice.

Finally the COVID19 app. You would be well aware that the Minister of Education declared that all mobile phones would be off and away for the school day. Some parents are concerned that this doesn't support them to have this app on their child's phone. I'm more than prepared to sit down with parents and discuss this with a possible solution. Remember though one of the things that makes schools safe is that every person coming in to our school for any period of time—other than dropping children off—is recorded as having been on site, tradesmen, teachers, support staff and consultants are all required to sign in. If by ANY chance there was a case of COVID19 on our premises we would immediately be able to trace all people on site, quickly and efficiently identifying where it had come from. Rest assured, your children are very safe in our schools.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING IN SCHOOLS DURING COVID-19

Public Health advice is clear – it is safe for schools to be open. This is because we have a low rate of Coronavirus (COVID-19) community spread in Tasmania and there has been increased and expanded testing. To reduce the risk even further, schools have hygiene and physical distancing measures in place.

While it is safe to send your child/ren to school, we still need adults to maintain a distance from other adults, whilst on site.

To help us with adult physical distancing, we are asking all parents/carers to:

Minimise the time you are on site of a morning when delivering children to school. Stop, drop and go is a term being used at other schools.

Make contact with the school by (teachers, principal, ancillary staff) telephone/email if you need to speak to us. Depending on your need, we may invite you in to school for a meeting where personal distancing can be facilitated.

We want to make school as safe as possible for everyone. Feel free to ask questions if you require any further information. These things won't be forever, but we all have a shared responsibility to act in a way that supports everyone being safe.

Limiting parents/adults on school sites.


Don't send them if:

CURRIED CHICKEN PIE

2 Chicken Thighs or Breasts

I sml Onion diced

2 sheets Pastry

I Carrot peeled & diced

I Stalk of Celery

50gms Butter

Milk to glaze

1/2 Chicken stock powder

1/3 peas

1/3 cup Corn

1/2 tsp Curry powder

1, 1/4 cups Milk

3 tbls Plain Flour




METHOD:

- 1. Grease a pie dish & place pastry in bottom cut to fit & one for the top of the pie. Oven at 180C
- 2. Place chicken in a pot of water to just cover & add the stock powder cook until chicken is cooked through, when cool cut into small pieces.
- 3. Dice onions, carrots & celery into small pieces.
- 4. Melt butter in saucepan when melted add flour stir until a paste, add milk gradually stirring in so it doesn't go lumpy &thickens, add curry powder leave to cool.
- 5. When mixture is cool add to cooked chicken, onion, carrots, peas & corn mix together & pour into dish lined with pastry.
- 6. Brush with a little milk, cook in oven for 30 minutes or until golden on top.

The Science class would like about 10 small spray bottles to be used in for science. If you have **any** old empty **lens cleaner bottles** like the one pictured below, the students would really appreciate them donated to science for some science experiments.







About the Challenge

10 books in 10 weeks

Students from Prep to Year 6 are challenged to make reading a part of their day and read 10 books in 10 weeks. They can negotiate with their teacher to have a large chapter book counted as being more than one book. Whilst reading 10 books means the student has completed the Challenge, they can read more. Extra pages can be downloaded to add to the reading log.

What can I read?

You are free to choose which fiction or non-fiction books to read for the Challenge.

Larger chapter books can be counted as more than one book - please talk to your teacher about how many chapters or pages can be counted as "one book".
