## BAKED JAM APPLE ROLY POLY

### Dough

1 cup SR Flour  
50gms Butter  
5 tbs Water or more if needed  
3tbs Jam Raspberry or Apricot

### Filling

Jam  
2 lrg Cooking Apples grated  
2 tbs Sultanas

### Syrup

1cup of hot water or apple juice  
Sprinkle of Cinnamon  
2 tbs Milk for glazing top  
50 grms Butter  
1/2 cup Sugar



### Method

Pre-heat oven on 180 fan forced. Grease a casserole dish with butter.  
Rub butter into flour until fine crumbs, until butter is all rubbed in, add water until dough comes together.  
On a floured surface gently knead together, roll out into a rectangular shape.  
Spread with jam, grated apple roll up tightly lengthwise, place in greased dish.  
Make a few slashes with a sharp knife on top of roll and brush with milk.  
Make the syrup by boiling the ingredients together for 2 minutes, pour over roll.  
Cook uncovered for 45 minutes or until golden on top.



## APPLE SLICE

1 cup Plain Flour  
1 Cup SR Flour  
1/2 cup Butter  
1/2 cup Sugar  
1 Egg Beaten  
2 cups Stewed Apple  
Cinnamon



### METHOD

- Pre-heat oven to 190 C.
- Grease and line a slice tray.
- Peel and cut apples into small pieces cook until soft.
- Sift the flours together, rub butter into flour to resemble bread crumbs.
- Stir through sugar, add beaten egg and mix into a firm dough.
- Gently knead until it forms a smooth dough, place in fridge for 5 minutes.
- Divide dough into two. Roll out then fit into greased lined tray.
- Remove and repeat with the other half but leave in the tray . Spread apples over top it should be 1cm thick , sprinkle with cinnamon.
- Top with the other half of the dough that was prepared earlier.
- Score top sheet of pastry into desired slice serving sizes.
- Bake for 25 minutes golden on top.
- Leave in tray to cool can ice if desire.


