Welcome to the latest school newsletter.

By the time you read this week's newsletter we will be down to only 6 more school days, and what a busy 6 days it is set to be.

Our final assembly of the term will be Monday 21 September from 2.00-2.45pm. Assemblies are a really important way of celebrating the successes of our students and enjoying the opportunity to have parents, guardians, family and community members come into the school and see what students have been focusing on and learning. Updated COVID -19 procedures will mean this assembly will take place in the gymnasium to ensure that visitors are able to physically distance. Chairs will be provided for you, however, when you take your seats I encourage you to ensure that you maintain a 1.5m distance from other adults outside of your family group. School children continue to be exempt from physical distancing based on advice from public health.

Later Monday evening from $5.30-7.00 \,\mathrm{pm}$ will be the second School Association meeting for the term. Accompanying this newsletter is a flyer which outlines the role of the School Association. The purpose of a School Association is to provide members with a way to participate and be involved in supporting the school. If you would like to be involved please come along on Monday.

As I have been wandering into Class 2 and Class 3 over the past few weeks I have noted an increase in excitement levels as students prepare for their extended day excursion to Port Arthur. This will take place on Wednesday 23 September. Due to the distance and travel time, parent support is required to ensure the bus is able depart the school earlier than the normal day starts. Students will need arrive at school before 8.00 am to allow the bus to leave at 8.00 am. Thank you in advance for your support with this. I am sure that the students and adults will have a fabulous day.

We are now in the final stages of planning our Pre-Kinder sessions for Term 4. If you have a child that is turning 5 in 2021, please complete an enrolment form as soon as possible so that we can include you in our very important Pre-Kinder sessions. Sessions will be Thursday from 1.30 – 2.30pm commencing on Thursday 29 October and concluding on Thursday 10 December.

Did you know?

The School Association Committee is an elected group of School Association members. The Committee represents the Association.

The Committee undertakes administrative and decision making activities on behalf of the Association, and to the benefit of the school.

Why get involved?

The fact sheet <u>School Associations</u> provides information on the valuable role of the Association. Being a Committee member is a commitment that is highly valued and recognised by the school.

Being on the Committee is a rewarding role, where parents and community members' skills and knowledge support the school. This contributes to helping learners succeed and provides an opportunity to be actively involved and engaged in the school.

The Committee is also a place of learning, contributing to developing experience and new skills for all members.

What are the roles in the Committee?

At the first meeting following their election, the Committee elects the following office holders:

- a chairperson (who must be a parent member or a community member, not an employee of the Department)
- a deputy chairperson (who can be a parent member or a community member, where possible not an employee of the Department)
- a secretary (can be a parent member, community member or staff member)
- a treasurer (can be a parent member, community member or staff member)

Is a Principal a member of the Committee?

The Principal is an ongoing member of the Committee, so is not subject to the election or rotation of office.

The Principal is not counted as a staff member in the Committee. For example, a Committee can have up to three staff members. This means that a Committee can include three staff members, plus the Principal.

How many Committee members are there?

To ensure the Committee is representative of the Association members, it must consist of a minimum of five elected members, including:

- · not less than three parent members;
- · not more than three community members; and
- at least one staff member, but no more than three staff members.





The maximum number of Committee members depends on your Association Constitution, which can be found in the Online register.

How often do the Committee meet?

The Committee meets at least once per term.

How can I get involved in the Committee?

If you are a member of the Association you can nominate to stand on the Committee. To be elected to the Committee you would need to complete a nomination form.

Committee ballots will take place before the end of the Association year or if there is a vacancy. The Chairperson or Principal can give you further information on your Committee. They can explain when nominations for the Committee are due and what roles are available.

How do I find out who is a Committee member?

Speak with the school or Committee to find out who is a current Committee member.








Launching into Learning children participated in some gross motor activities this week

Our students made One Pot Spaghetti and Spaghetti Bolognaise.















ONE POT SPAGHETTI BOLOGNESE

1 tbls Olive Oil 1 Onion Finely diced
2 Medium Carrots grated 1 clove of Garlic crushed
Chilli flakes (optional) 1sml Zucchini grated
500gms Beef Mince 1 tblsWorcestershire sauce

3 tbls Passata or Tomato paste sauce 2 1/2 cups of Chicken Stock

400 grm Tin Tomatoes Salt & Pepper to taste

250 grms Pasta or Wholemeal



METHOD:

Heat oil in a large saucepan(it needs to big enough to hold the Bolognese & spaghetti) over medium heat.

Add onion, carrot & garlic & cook for 3 minutes.

Stir in zucchini & cook for another 2 minutes.

Add the mince to the pan & cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until the meat is nicely browned, breaking up any lumps .

Pour in the passata, tomato, stock, season with salt & pepper stir to combine, cover with lid & bring to boil.

Reduce the heat to medium & remove the lid.

Add the pasta & simmer, stirring regularly, for 15 minutes until the pasta is al dente.

Sprinkle with parmesan cheese & basil leaves.





SPAGHETTI BOLONAISE

500 gm Beef Mince 2 tsps. Oil

1 Onion diced finely
1/4 cup Tomato Paste
400 gm can Tomatoes
1 tsp Sugar
1 tsp Oregano & Basil
1 Carrot grated
1/2 Zucchini grated





METHOD

- Heat oil on medium in a pan, add onion & lightly cook until changed colour, add garlic cook for 1 to 2 minutes.
- Add mince stirring & breaking up the lumps stirring constantly until browned.
- Stir in remaining ingredients & keep stirring until all ingredients are mixed in.
- When boiling reduce to low heat, cover & simmer gently for minutes.
- Serve spaghetti with crusty bread or rolls, & cheese sprinkled on top.
