Chocolate & Hazelnut Brownie,
and Honeycomb.



















#### CHOCOLATE & HAZELNUT BROWNIE

150gm Butter 1 1/2 cups Sugar 3/4 cup Plain Flour 1 tsp Vanilla essence

3 Eggs 1/2 tsp Salt 1/2 tsp Baking Powder 1/2 Cocoa

1/4 cup Choc chips 1/3 cup Hazelnuts



#### METHOD

- Pre-heat oven to 170 c, grease & line a 20cm square cake tin or slice tray.
- Soften butter, add sugar & vanilla essence mix to combined.
- Add eggs one at a time beat well.
- Sift dry ingredients, choc bits & hazelnuts together & gradually add to wet mixture do not over mix.
- Spread brownie mixture over greased & line cake tin or slice tray.
- Bake for 30-35 minutes in a fan forced oven or (40– 45 minutes if not fan forced oven).
- Use a skewer to test if skewer comes out clean remove brownie from oven leave in pan for 10 minutes before removing from tin.
- Leave cool cut into squares.

### HONEYCOMB

1 Cup Sugar

1/4 cup Golden Syrup

3 tbls Water

2 tsp Bi-carb soda



### METHOD

- Grease a slice tin 30 x 20cm with butter or spray set aside.
- In a saucepan add sugar, golden syrup & water over medium heat until sugar is dissolved.
- Bring sugar syrup & water to a simmer for 5 minutes.
- Place your slice tin close to the stove & remove saucepan from the heat, add bi-carb soda to the saucepan mixing it in quickly, it will froth up tripling its size.
- Immediately pour hot mixture into slice tin & leave to cool.
- As it begins to set lightly score it with a sharp knife into bite size pieces so you can break into smaller pieces when fully set.
- Store in an air tight container.

Donations of used Children and Young Adult books are welcome and can be left at the office.










Last Friday we completed our STEM engineering task (building bridges out of paddle pop sticks)




WE ARE BACK FROM THE LOCKDOWN! AND WHAT BETTER WAY TO DUST OFF THE COBWEBS THAN A WALKING TOUR THROUGH OLD HOBART TOWN

Hobart's waterfront is filled with amazing history and we want to share some of the great stories about convicts, whalers, explorers, traders and workers who used to work, sleep and play around Sullivans Cove, back in the 19th Century.

Did you know that a Danish sailor, who once proclaimed himself ruler of Iceland, was a convict in Hobart? How did Salamanca Place get its name? What mammal kept people awake at night in early Hobart, but it has no legs? The answers to these and many more interesting stories from our history will be found on the tour.

So, pack some snacks and a drink, some good clothing and shoes for walking (you might need something warm though – winter weather may still lurk just around the next corner), and a hat if it is sunny. Be prepared to walk a fair distance and climb some steps. This will be your holiday challenge!
